Funeral services for Charles Montag, 82, rural Groton, were held at 10:30 a.m.; Wednesday, March 22, at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Aberdeen with the Rev. Howard Carroll officiating. Burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens with military graveside rites by the Columbia American Legion Post No. 58. The Huebl Funeral Chapel was in charge of arrangements.

A liturgical wake service was held at 7 p.m., Tuesday evening, at the Chapel.

Active casket bearers were Terry Ochs, Aberdeen; Roger Rohwedder, Wetonka; and Jerroll Erdmann, Douglas Harms, Donald Henley and Robert Pray Sr., Groton.

Mr. Montag died Saturday afternoon, March 18, at Dakota Midland Hospital in Aberdeen.

Charles Montag was born January 24, 1896, at Crab Orchard, Ky. He grew to manhood there and entered the U.S. Army during World War I. Following his discharge he traveled in the United States before settling in Brown County. He worked in the Stratford, Houghton and Columbia areas and at one time operated a road construction business. He married Lilliemay Broadbent November 20, 1935, at Leola and they made their home at Tacoma Park where he managed the dance hall. A year later they moved to their present home two miles south of Tacoma Park where he was engaged in truck driving. He also did woodcarving.

Survivors include his widow; one daughter, Mrs. Kenneth (Lois) Davis, Bath; one sister, Mrs. Rose Jones, Cincinnati, Ohio; and four grandchildren.

Four brothers and five sisters preceded him in death.
