PAETZNICK FUNERAL HELD HERE MONDAY

GROTON LADY LAID TO REST IN
LOCAL CEMETERY; EX-
PIRED LAST WEEK

The funeral of Mrs. Theresa Paetznick, who expired last Thursday, was held from St. John's Lutheran church on Monday. The funeral rites were conducted by Rev. F. E. Wilke in the presence of a large gathering of sorrowing friends and relatives, who filled the church to capacity. Interment was made in Groton cemetery.

The death of Mrs. Paetznick occurred last Thursday, following an attack of pneumonia. She had not enjoyed satisfactory health for some time, having recently returned from an Aberdeen hospital, where she went for treatment.

The deceased was born in Germany December 8, 1866, being about 68 years of age at the time of her death. When 17 years of age she came to this country with her mother and shortly thereafter, July 5, 1883, was united in marriage to Frank Paetznick, who passed away in 1920.

There are left surviving her two sons, two daughters and two brothers. The sons are Franz Paetznick, of Woodburn, Ore., and William of Groton. The daughters are Mrs. Eugene Funk of this city and Mrs. Ed. Koepsel of Oregon City, Ore., while her brothers are Otto Kuhnert of St. Paul, Minn., and Gust Kuhnert of Groton. She is also survived by three nieces, two nephews and six grandchildren.

Mrs. Paetznick was beloved by a large circle of friends and she will be sadly missed from their circle as time goes on.
