DEATH COMES TO YOUNG GROTON GIRL

MISS LOUISE REYNOLDS SUC- CUMBS TO AFTER EFFECTS OF OPERATION

Miss Louise Reynolds, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Reynolds, of this city, died in an Aberdeen hospital, Sunday morning. Her death was caused by the after effects of an operation performed some time ago for a mastoid. She recovered from the operation splendidly and came home to recuperate. Shortly after arriving home complications developed and she was hurried back to the hospital, but all that medical science could do was unavailing and she breathed her last at ten minutes past six.

The news of Miss Reynolds' death was a great shock to the people, who had watched her grow from infancy and blossom into young womanhood with all its loveliness and charm.

Miss Reynolds was born in Groton on April 13th, 1907. She attended the Groton school, receiving her diploma with the graduating class of 1924, being an honor student. Following her graduation here she went to the University at Mitchell and took a Normal course, completing it in 1926. In the fall of the same year she accepted a position with the public schools at Artesian and taught there for one term, and was re-elected to teach next year.

Miss Reynolds was a life-long member of the Methodist church, was very active in the departmental work of that congregation, taking a great interest in the Sunday school and Epworth league. She was also a talented musician and gave freely of her efforts to the enjoyment of others.

The funeral was held at the home Tuesday afternoon, conducted by Rev. Ray. The ladies quartet composed of Mrs. J. J. Warkentin, Mrs. H. C. Dobson, Mrs. Bessie Cook and Mrs. Joe Williams furnished the music. Honorary pall bearers were Maurice Troy, Sam Mather, Lambert Miller, Vance Miller, Desmond Brant and Robert Dunn, while active pall bearers were Dr. John Adams, of Aberdeen; Dr. Sheldon Adams, of Yankton; Charles Adams and C. K. Neff, of Groton. The home was literally banked with flowers loving and thoughtful friends had sent.

The remains were laid to rest in Groton cemetery. H. Paetznick had charge of the funeral.
