Emil Rose, 89, Groton died Saturday, Sept. 26, 1998 at the Colonial Manor of Groton. His funeral was Tuesday, Sept. 29, 1998 at St. John's Lutheran Church, Groton, with the Rev. Craig Grams officiating.

Burial was in Sunset Memorial Gardens, Aberdeen, with Paetznick-Garness Funeral Chapel, Groton, in charge of arrangements.

A Public Prayer Service was held Monday evening at the funeral chapel.
