HENRY ROSENOW DIES

Passes Away at His Home South of City Thursday Night.

As the result of an attack of tuberculosis of the lungs, Henry Rosenow passes away at his home south of Groton, Thursday evening at about midnight.

Mr. Rosenow became the victim of the dread disease some two years ago, when, following an injury of the chest, he contracted a cold. He thought but little of the injury at the time, and did not deem it sufficiently serious to warrant calling a physician, but as time progressed he grew worse instead of better until taken as above recorded.

Funeral services were held from the home at 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon, and from Hanson church at 3 o'clock, interment being in Hanson cemetery, Rev. Burmeister, of Hanson church, officiating.

Deceased was born March 19, 1889, in Hanson township, Brown county, South Dakota. He was a member of Hanson church of long standing, having been born and raised in its community. He received catechetical instructions under Rev. Haertling and was confirmed by him April 5, 1903. He gained his earthly sustenance as a farmer, owning a nice quarter section of land in Hanson. His parents had their home with him.

The time of his earthly pilgrimage was 27 years, 4 months, 28 days.

He leaves to mourn his loss, his bereaved parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Rosenow, Sr., two brothers, Karl and William, Jr., and one sister, Mrs. Paul Rose, of Westport.

Mr. Rosenow was well liked by everyone who knew him. While the end was not unexpected, the news came to Groton as a distinct shock to his many friends for the reason that it was only a few days before his death that he had been up and around and about his usual duties.
