## George A. Stange

Services for George A. Stange, 78, of 1123 North Jay Street in Aberdeen, were held at 2 p.m. Monday, Feb. 9, at Our Savior's Lutheran Church with the Rev. Raymond Pomplun officiating.

Mr. Stange died Friday evening at St. Luke's Hospital.
