DEATH OF CARL VOIGT.

News of the demise Carl Voigt at Havana, N. D., was received by relatives in this vicinity Friday. Mr. Voigt was drawing hay and riding on the load on Wednesday of last week when death suddenly overtook him, as the result of heart failure. Deceased was 49 years of age and leaves a wife and nine children, four sons and five daughters.

Carl Voigt was an early settler in Brown county, having come here in 1881. He took up land in the vicinity of James and established the first store in that thriving little town. He was highly esteemed by his fellowmen for his sterling qualities, and his departure for North Dakota with his family about a year ago was much regretted. The remains were brought to the home of his parents near James Friday afternoon and followed to Union cemetery by a large concourse of friends where interment took place. He was a member of the Maccabees, M. A. and A. O. U. W. and carried \$6,000 insurance.
