Mrs. Raymond Wing

Mrs. Raymond (Rose) Wing, 70, rural Groton, died Thursday morning at St. Luke's Hospital.

Services were held at 2:00 p. m., Monday, Oct. 28, at the Huebl Chapel in Aberdeen with the Rev. David R. Rasmussen officiating. Burial was in Riverside cemetery.

Music was provided by David Sueltz, soloist, who sang, "How Great Thou Art," and "In the Garden" accompanied by Mrs. John Evens, organist.

Honorary pall bearers were Roy Edwards, Lloyd Larson, Arthur Rix and James Rix.

Active pall bearers were Kent Baird, Clarence Erickson, Clarence Adler, Oliver Erickson, Richard Ruden and Lyle Thompson.

Rose E. Schott was born July 4, 1898 on a farm in Gem Township. She attended rural schools and for two years attended Northern Normal. She taught rural schools and in September, 1919, was married to Clark Thurston in Aberdeen. Mr. Thurston died in 1920 and she returned to Northern, where she received a degree.

She returned to teaching in Gem Township. On June 6, 1925, she was married to Max Hoeft. They farmed near Stratford for a time, then purchased a farm west of Aberdeen. In 1936, they moved to a farm in Gem Township. Mr. Hoeft died in 1958 and she remained on the farm. On Sept. 8, 1964, she was married to Raymond Wing in Aberdeen. They continued to live on the farm.

She attended the Christian Science Church and was a member of the Henry Benefit and Social Club.

Survivors include her husband; one stepson, Dwayne Wing, LaGrande, Ore.; one stepdaughter, Mrs. John Schuck, Aberdeen; one brother, Walter Schott, Groton; three sisters, Mrs. Chester Luke, Bath; Mrs. Minnie Zoellner, Groton and Mrs. Cora Sparks, Denver, Colo.; and one grandchild.

One brother and three sisters preceded her in death.
