Services for Karl (Charles) Zumm, 85, were held at 1:30 p. m., Friday, Sept. 13 at the Zion Lutheran Church in Andover. He died Monday at the Bethesda Nursing Home in Webster.

The Rev. H. A. Kriefall officiated and burial was in the Pierpont Cemetery.

He later moved to the Pierpont and Andover areas and farmed until his retirement in 1955 when he moved into Pierpont. He was a member of the Zion Lutheran Church of Andover.
